## VISION & MISSION

**Vision:** The Providence Public School District will be a national leader in educating urban youth.

**Mission:** The Providence Public School District will prepare all students to succeed in the nation's colleges and universities, and in their chosen professions.

## SCHOOLS

The Providence Public School District (PPSD) has 42 schools, 4 annexes, 1 center, 2 charter schools. Four schools are site-based managed (\*).

## CLASS SIZE

PPSD has a student to teacher ratio of 26:1 for general education in all schools. Special education self-contained has a student to teacher ratio of 10:1.

## Free and Reduced Lunch Percentages:

Elementary: 82% free, 6% reduced, 4% paid  
Middle: 83% free, 6% reduced, 5% paid  
High: 74% free, 8% reduced, 7% paid

PPSD sponsors a Universal Free Lunch Program in all middle and high schools. All students qualify for this program, as long as they return a completed lunch application to their school.

## ATHLETICS

PPSD recognizes the health benefits of physical activity. Sports activities help students gain a sense of self-confidence, belonging and discipline.

### There are:

- 1,860 athletes
- 71 athletic teams
- 150 students participate in the Alternative Athletics Program

## TRANSPORTATION

There are 150 busses for the PPSD schools (including 14 wheelchair busses). This includes 20 busses for charter schools, 22 busses for tuition and special education students, and 31 for private and parochial students. Approximately 2,345 regular education high school students receive monthly RIPTA bus passes based on living more than three miles from the high school they are attending. Special accommodations are made for financial and/or medical hardships.

Special Education: As of January of 2011, 4,560 students, ages 3-21 were identified as having disabilities in the city of Providence.

## ESCUELAS

El Distrito de Escuelas Públicas de Providence (PPSD, siglas en inglés) tiene 42 escuelas, 4 escuelas anexas, 1 centro y 2 escuelas tipo "charter". Cuatro de las escuelas son administradas independientemente (\*).

## NÚMERO DE ALUMNOS POR AULA

Existe una proporción estudiantil de 26:1 en la educación básica, en cada escuela. Las escuelas de Educación Especial Independientes cuentan con una proporción estudiantil de 10:1.

## Porcentaje de Estudiantes que Reciben Almuerzos Gratis o Precios Reducidos:

- Primaria: 82% gratis, 6% reducido, 4% pagado
- Intermedia: 83% gratis, 6% reducido, 5% pagado
- Secundaria: 74% gratis, 8% reducido, 7% pagado

PPSD auspicia un Programa de Almuerzos Gratis Universal para las intermedias y secundarias. Todos los estudiantes califican para este programa, siempre que completen y entreguen una solicitud para los almuerzos gratis.

## ATLETISMO

PPSD reconoce los beneficios de salud que provee el ejercicio. El deporte ayuda a los estudiantes a desarrollar seguridad en si mismos y disciplina.

### Actualmente existen:

- 1,860 atletas
- 71 equipos deportivos
- 150 estudiantes en el Programa Atlético Alternativo

## TRANSPORTE

Se cuenta con 150 buses para las Escuelas de Providence (14 para sillas de ruedas). Esto incluye a 20 buses para escuelas "chárter", 22 para estudiantes de matrícula y educación especial, y 31 para escuelas privadas y parroquiales. Aproximadamente, 2,345 estudiantes de secundaria en educación regular reciben un pase mensual de RIPTA, basado en que viven a más de 3 millas de la secundaria. Arreglos especiales son hechos para los que tienen dificultades financieras y médicas.
