SCHOOL HISTORY

Dr. Jorge Alvarez High School was founded in 2005 with a single class (9th grade). In its third academic year (2007-2008) the school moved to a new building on Adelaide Avenue and welcomed three grade levels 9th, 10th and 11th. In June of 2008, the name was officially changed to Dr. Jorge Alvarez High School.

CURRICULUM

The school day is organized on a rotating six period schedule. Students are enrolled in 7 courses and one course is dropped each day. Students take seven 56 minute classes per semester. For 9th, 10th and 11th grade, students are enrolled in English, Math, Science and Social Studies for the entire year. English and Math for 12th graders is yearlong as well as all AP classes, which students can enroll in beginning in their junior year. AHS was also the first high school in Rhode Island to pilot Next Generation Science Standards, which were implemented in grades 9-11.

GPA is calculated based on a grading scale (see next page). Beginning with ninth grade, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. Courses taken outside of the Providence Public School District are not included in the grade point calculation. Only AP Courses are weighted .10.
