

Harry Kizirian

a Providence native, is one of the nation's most decorated World War II servicemen for his actions in combat in the Pacific Theater.

He graduated Mount Pleasant High School on February 22, 1944, where he was recognized as the most outstanding athlete of his class.

Kizirian enlisted in the Marine Corps on Feb. 23, 1944 and was sent overseas on October 6, 1944

While on Okinawa in May 1945, facing enemy machine gun fire that had pinned down his platoon. Kizirian fearlessly charged the enemy position, freeing the trapped Americans. The following month, though already wounded three times. Kizirian engaged and eliminated an enemy force that had surrounded a team of American troops evacuating wounded soldiers.

Kizirian entered the U.S. Postal Service after his discharge from the Marine Corps on Feb. 11, 1946. Ultimately, he would serve as the postmaster for the City of Providence. In recognition of his continued outstanding service, Rhode Island's main post office was renamed the Harry Kizirian Post Office.


