KIZIRIAN RECOGNIZED AS 5-STAR PRE-KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM

PPSD, along with **Governor Dan McKee** and the **Rhode Island Department of Education (RIDE)**, are happy to announce that the **Harry Kizirian Elementary School Pre-Kindergarten (Pre-K)** program has been awarded the **BrightStars** 5-star rating. This is their highest rating. They are the second school in the District to receive this 5-star rating. [BrightStars](#) assesses child care centers, preschools in public schools, family child care homes and stand-alone school-age programs across multiple quality standards and quality criteria. The Rhode Island Association for the Education of Young Children is the managing agency for BrightStars. BELL TIMES FOR 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

PPSD released an updated **Bell Times** and **Academic Calendar** to families in late June. The updates were a result of the Providence Teachers Union (PTU) vote to ratify an agreement for the 2023-2024 school year. This one-year contract proposes to put into effect an additional 30 minutes of instruction each day, four annual professional development days in August for teachers and 90 minutes of biweekly professional development during the out-of-school time hours. Equity Grants enable students and educators to test creative new ideas and innovations that support exemplary teaching and learning, while advancing cultural understanding and appreciation, anti-racism commitments, and understanding of civic engagement and democracy. Equity Boost Grants will fund projects budgeted between \$500 and \$4900, annually.

Who can apply? PPSD School Faculty/Staff on behalf of the classroom, school, and/or as a sponsor for a student led project, can apply.
