### The District will once again provide all students and staff with

a kit of two free at-home COVID-19 tests prior to school vacation. At-home tests will be distributed to students and parents on April 13 and 14. Families should follow instructions included in each box to conduct at-home testing the day before their student(s) return to school from vacation. Students who test positive must isolate for five days and parents and guardians should report that information to their child's school. 




