We made it to the end of another difficult pandemic school year. I want to again say a big congratulations to all of our graduating seniors - we're proud of you and we can't wait to see the amazing things you do in the future!

And we have dozens of projects underway that show the value of **Efficient District Systems** in improving our schools. Projects like the Narducci Learning Center, millions of dollars in renovations to bring schools into the 21st century, new heating and cooling equipment in buildings, and water bottle fillers in every school.
- We also added increased supports in all of our schools across the District when our staff and students needed it most. Supports like Assistant Principals, Guidance Counselors, and Community Specialists. And this summer, we'll continue to close achievement gap with

more than 3,000 students in high quality summer learning programs. The list goes on and on, but I only have so much space here! We finally have a foundation for success. I truly believe that all of your efforts have PPSD at a turning point. It's an honor to work with all of you, and I look forward to building on this positive momentum through the summer and into next year.






