




SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER

Providence students. Enjoy your retirement!


SCHOOL CHOICE FAIR

Lessons, Activities and Resources for Black Lives Matter at School Year of Purpose - Part 1

The Office of Equity and Belonging is proud to support The Teaching for Black Lives (BLM) teacher study group, a PPSD teacher-led initiative. The study group will be hosting a Zoom Professional Development (PD) session for fellow educators, counselors, and administrators on **Wednesday**, **November 15 from 5:00 p.m. - 6:30 p.m.** to learn about the Black Lives Matter at School Year of Purpose. The session will review the BLM 13 guiding principles and provide opportunities to explore resources and plan ways to integrate Black Lives Matter at School lessons, activities, and materials into our practices. This PD will be scaffolded to be accessible for all grade level divisions and content areas. This is a paid professional learning opportunity (negotiated district rate). PPSD staff can register on Frontline.

Gender Equity Policies

The Office of Equity and Belonging will be hosting its final **Gender Equity Policies training** on 11/9 via Zoom from 4:00 p.m. - 4:45 p.m. This training will review the following policies: Title IX, Equal Opportunity/Affirmative Action, Nondiscrimination Policy for Transgender and Gender Expansive Students, and the Workplace Gender Transition Policy. Are there any exciting new things being unveiled in your school this year?

This year, DelSesto Middle School is launching elements of its new redesign model, including new electives such as band, Bootstrap Algebra, SeaPerch, and Automation and Robotics. DelSesto will be creating an outdoor learning space through the Learning Inside Out Project funded through RIDE. Our Digital Media teacher is collaborating with a creative writing teacher to create weekly podcasts that feature our students and teachers. We also have a digital music class where kids create their own songs.

What is your vision or goal for your student body for the 2023-24 school year at this time?

DelSesto Middle School's mission is to integrate Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math into curricular activities to inspire students to become critical thinkers capable of using 21st century skills to build real-world solutions and solve relevant community challenges.

DelSesto Middle School's vision is to empower students to become global leaders by cultivating a community that fosters equity, belonging, and challenging expectations which will prepare them for high school, college, and the career of their choice.

We hope that our students grow to be inspired critical thinkers, with 21st-century skills that empower them to pursue the high school and college or career of their choice.

What is your goal for staff in the 2023-24 school year?

We aim to provide quality learning experiences based on grade level standards, develop strong relationships with their students and each other, and work to create the necessary work-life balance which will make them more energetic and productive. We want our staff to feel supported by the building administration and District offices. For example, our math coach is working with her teachers and Michelle Johnson from the Multilingual Learners (MLL) department to support learners with math curriculum, and provide teachers with strategies that will ensure understanding of the content.

VEAZIE STREET STUDENT LEADERSHIP MEMBERS






PRE-K CORNER VEAZIE STREET PRE-K STUDENTS
