We've been working around the clock to ensure the right academic and socialemotional supports are in place for students to thrive this academic year. And, we are excited to share that, under the Providence Turnaround, we have opened three new schools this year as part of our \$600+ million school construction plan that will raise the percentage of students learning in a high-quality space from just 5% currently, to 50%! I had the opportunity to visit our new buildings and a number of other schools on opening day and saw the excitement of students, parents, and educators first-hand. We started strong and look forward to having a productive 23-24 academic year. However, I need your help in making sure your child is in school, on time, every day.

One of the best ways to ensure that students have a strong year is through attendance. To promote attendance and raise awareness of the impact of absences, Providence Public School District (PPSD) recently delivered **Attendance Hero** packets to all students which include:

- Attendance tracking magnets with the academic calendar
- Attendance pledges for parents and students to sign
- Please use these tools with your child, to remind them how important attendance is, and to pledge to achieve perfect attendance this school year.

School absences add up fast and can have serious consequences. For example, if a student misses one day every two weeks, that equals 20 days absent (about 3 weeks) per year. A student who has missed 18 days (about 2 and a half weeks), is considered chronically absent in Rhode Island. When a student is chronically absent, they may fall behind and it puts their promotion in doubt.

Students should be present and ready to learn every day. With your help, care, and support -we can work together to achieve perfect attendance for your child. Let's strive to be Attendance Heroes this school year and ensure our students can succeed!

SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT NATHANAEL GREENE MIDDLE SCHOOL

What makes your school unique?

Nathanael Greene Middle School (NGMS), home of the Bucks, is Providence's largest grades 6-8 middle school offering programs including self-contained, inclusion, MLL, and advanced academics. Greene is home to an amazing computer science program, an incrementally talented student band, numerous sports championships, incredible students, and hard-working teachers.

Are there any exciting new things being unveiled in your school this year?

This is OUR year! We are so excited to bring a new and improved NGMS to Providence students and families this year! Prior to the summer, Greene faculty and staff developed a brand new vision along with three new instructional priorities: small group instruction, station rotation, and differentiation. Various small rooms and previous storage spaces have been converted into small group intervention spaces with state-of-the-art learning furniture and materials to conduct 4-6 interventions targeting individual student needs. We also have developed small group instruction stations throughout the halls of the school and are redesigning the foyer



to lend itself to small group learning as well. Our library space has been re-constructed to foster 21st century learning, adding a makerspace which will further our rigorous computer science programs. Next up? Two stars!

What is your vision or goal for your student body for the 2023-24 school year at this time?

Our vision is to make NGMS the destination for education and exit one star status. To get there, we have developed a schoolwide writing strategy that is used across classrooms, a bi-weekly RICAs writing program, small group interventions and curated spaces, and both Literacy and STEM teams. We want our Bucks prepared and knowledgeable about all available future opportunities and for them to know that they can take on anything!

What is your goal for staff in the 2023-24 school year?

Our staff goal is to increase the culture in the building and focus on their development of station rotation, small group instruction, and differentiation. We have instituted monthly potluck lunches, staff gatherings, professional development trainings, and collaborative time to foster their professional relationships and growth. Our number one question is what do you need and how can we support you. At Greene, we are a team that are all rowing the boat in the same direction.

Does your school have a mascot or school colors?

We are the Nathanael Greene Bucks and our school colors are green and gold.

Is there anything else you would like to share with the PPSD community?

We are extremely excited for this year and cannot wait to see all of the great things that our school will accomplish! We have amazing staff and students and know that the future for Greene is bright! Go Bucks!

School Safety Patrol members:

- Follow all classroom/school rules and respect teachers and students at all times.
- Report to duty on time.
- Wear proper equipment. Patrols will not be permitted to perform their duties if they are not wearing a patrol belt.
- Do the morning announcements each morning on the intercom, leading the entire school in Pledge of Allegiance and the Fogarty School Pledge.
- Attend and participate in all patrol meetings and training sessions.
- Be able to communicate courteously and appropriately with students and adults.
- Report any perceived dangerous safety issues to the teacher on duty.

Typically, teachers and principals appoint patrol members, who participate with parental approval. A teacher usually serves as the patrol advisor. Congratulations to all those who were chosen to be a part of Fogarty Elementary School's Safety Patrol Team for the 23-24 school year!
