Attire

- This is a formal event and student attire should be reflective of this.
- Female Students – Formal Dress or Formal Pantsuit and no sneakers
- Male Student – Suit or tuxedo, Tie, Button Down Shirt and Dress Slacks and no sneakers

Behavior

- All School District and School rules outlined in the Providence Schools Code of Conduct and the *Classical High School Student Handbook* must be followed.
- Grinding on a dance partner or engaging in other dancing that is sexual in nature is not acceptable.
- Couples and partners must face each other while dancing.
- Aggressive or dangerous dancing such as “slam” dancing is not acceptable.

**Students who are found to be in violation of any of the above expectations or policies will be asked to leave a school dance and are subject to further disciplinary action.*
