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Course Description

English Language Development is a rigorous class that aims to develop students' English proficiency levels in all four domains of language (reading, writing, speaking, and listening). It is also meant to support students in their other general education classes through development of critical thinking skills, academic vocabulary, and writing skills. Each lesson is designed to teach students both content and oral/written language skills. The curriculum is developed with WIDA standards, Common Core standards, and College Readiness Standards.

Course Text/Content

Students in the ELD3G11 Course will utilize the EDGE Level B textbook and consumable workbook. Students will be responsible for their workbook and for replacing it should it go missing. To avoid any issues, I will require that students keep their textbooks in my classroom, unless other arrangements are made with me in advance.

Grading

Grading in this course is based on practice and mastery. Major assignments will be considered “summative” and will include projects, essays, and tests. Minor assignments will be considered “formative” and will include classwork and quizzes. Homework will be assigned most nights of the week and is due in class the next day. The grading breakdown is as follows, and is subject to change as the teacher sees fit.

- Summative Assessments (Projects, Essays, and Tests): 60%
- Formative Assessments (Quizzes, major classwork, Do Nows): 30%
- Homework (Checked at the beginning of class): 10%

Late Work

Late work will be accepted for 7 days after it is due. Within the 7 day period, students may stay after school. On Monday, Wednesday and Thursday there are English teachers who stay after school to complete missing work for a readjusted grade. If a student would like to work with Mrs. Chantre on missing work, students must make an appointment. Work turned in after 7 days will not be counted unless there are extenuating circumstances (medical or family issues, or other situations determined to be entirely out of the student’s control).

Make-up Work

In the event of an absence, students are responsible for finding out what work they have missed and should turn it in within the seven-day period as stated above. If the absence is excused in Skyward, the assignment will not be counted late for the days on which the student was absent. If the absence is unexcused, Mrs. Chantre will follow the rules stated above for late work.
