Course Name: English Language Development (ELD)

Instructor Name: Mrs. Eggleston

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Course Description: This course is meant to develop a student's listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills in English for everyday and academic purposes. It is also meant to support students in their other general education classes through development of critical thinking skills, academic vocabulary, and writing skills. Each lesson is designed to teach students both content and oral/written language skills. The curriculum is developed with WIDA standards, Common Core standards, and College Readiness Standards. The textbooks used for this course will be *Inside Level A, B, or C* depending on students' English Language Proficiency level.

También está destinado a apoyar a los estudiantes en sus otras clases de educación general a través del desarrollo de habilidades de pensamiento crítico, vocabulario académico y escritura. habilidades. Cada lección está diseñada para enseñar a los estudiantes tanto el contenido como las habilidades del lenguaje oral / escrito. El plan de estudios se desarrolla con los estándares WIDA, los estándares básicos comunes y los estándares de preparación universitaria. Los libros de texto utilizados para este curso serán los niveles internos A, B o C, según el nivel de dominio del idioma inglés de los estudiantes.

Expectations of Course:
